I have been honored to serve once again as the Unit 174 President. My first term was mostly during the pandemic, from April 2021 to April 2022. In January of 2022 we hosted our Lone Star Regional (LSR). It was our first tournament since the LSR of 2020. It was a learning experience for all of us, but we did our best. The presidency was quite different in 2023. We had three regular sectionals and a fourth was held in Galveston in October 2023. Our tournament table counts were not nearly as high as the pre-Covid table counts, but they are slowly improving. The 2024 LSR was a big improvement over last year's, but our 1800+ table count was far less than the 3000+ in 2020. As our fixed costs are the same, it is difficult for our regional to be as great a money maker as those the past regionals; but the numbers are slowly increasing. We are also pleased to see the attendance slowly increasing at the local club games, as more and more bridge players are returning to face-to-face games. For those still playing bridge online, ACBL started the EDGAR program, which monitors for cheating, to keep everyone honest.

A very special thank you must go to the other officers and board members of our unit. They have put in many long hours to plan and carry out our sectionals and our regional, and we have a great crew of directors to help run our tournaments.

This is my last president's message, and it comes with bittersweet thoughts. Unit 174 has come a long way since our 2020 regional, but there is much work to be done. A primary focus will be to increase our membership. Having all our great instructors is a real bonus. They offer a variety of bridge classes, private group lessons and online lessons as well. Our Future Life Masters leaders have set up great programs for the novice players which are a model for other units.

I have been proud to serve as president of Unit 174, and I thank you for giving me this opportunity.

Member Profile





Who is the *real* Dave Glandorf?

Dave Glandorf of Houston and Education Director for the Clear Lake Bridge Club (CLBC) of Unit 174, was born in

Dubugue, Iowa. His family moved Williamsburg, Iowa where he was raised. He graduated from high school in Williamsburg and attended Iowa State University. He decided to study aerospace engineering because of Sputnik although he can't remember going outside to watch it fly over like many were doing in 1957. During the spring of his sophomore year at Iowa State in 1960, he began having qualms about his choice to study aerospace engineering and was trying to decide if he should do a double major in both aerospace and electrical engineering or get his bachelor's in aerospace engineering and do a master's in electrical engineering.

In the end, he decided to double major. This decision added an additional year to his undergraduate degree, but he stuck to it. Dave mentioned as an aside that he found the electrical engineering program a little easier. (Although he asked that I not mention that.) But in true Dave Glandorf style he said the reason it was probably easier was because he was ahead of his peers because he had more mathematics when starting the program. He likened this to how so many of his bridge students always mention to him how much easier a bridge class is when taking it the second time. I happen to be one of those students who share that sentiment.

After completion of his double major, Dave felt like he still didn't know enough so he did a master's in aerospace engineering and then decided to do a Ph.D. as well. I asked him to give me the title of his dissertation knowing that it would probably be over the heads of many, but he complied: *Optimal Fixed-Time Orbital Transfer with a Radial Constraint*. I'll bet some of our members might have a clue; it is definitely over my head.

Dave decided that rather than go into teaching, it would be better to work a few years and he was courted by several companies. He decided to work for Lockheed (now Lockheed Martin) at the Johnson Space Center in the Clear Lake Area of Greater Houston. He wanted to be closer to the action. He married his wife, Becky, while still an undergraduate and Dave, Becky and their daughter made the move to Clear Lake in 1967.

A real job felt almost luxurious after living on graduate student stipends. Dave and some of his work friends could afford to dine out during lunch. He said that "There were about three restaurants on Bay Area Blvd." After a couple of months that got old, so everyone started brown bagging and a lunch time bridge game was started. (He mentioned that he first played rubber bridge in the spring of 1959 at his fraternity house. Later over one of the undergraduate holidays, a friend took him to a duplicate game at a country club.)

The lunch time bridge games ran Monday-Friday although not everyone played every day. Initially, it started with one table and eventually grew to two. They even started playing Swiss Teams games. No one had any duplicate boards but they rigged it all up with rubber bands and slips of paper.

This group didn't just play. Following the play, they discussed the hands to try to learn from each deal. Dave started to emerge as the "Bridge Guru". At some point, he reached out to Lockheed management and got permission to use the offices and he started teaching Contract Bridge classes after hours which were free.

One Saturday, he and Becky went to Almeda Mall which was the closest shopping mall to Clear Lake. Clear Lake didn't have any bookstores back then so while Becky shopped, Dave went to B. Dalton Bookseller and was browsing. He saw a section with chess books so wondered if there were any bridge books. He discovered, Alfred Sheinwold's "5 Weeks to Winning Bridge." Dave said he remembered in the forward it says something like "This book will do you no good if you take it home and put it on the bookshelf." Well, three years later, Dave took the book from his bookshelf and his five weeks turned into about five months of study.

A work colleague and fellow bridge player knew of a duplicate game in the Clear Lake Area. Dave joined ACBL on October 1, 1984. He and his colleague started playing sanctioned duplicate bridge at a club in Seabrook owned by Lorna Walser. Unfortunately, Dave's colleague moved away that Christmas.

In the late 1980's, Ed Allen started the CLBC. Ed retired in the late 1990's and gave the club to the members. In 2002, Dave and fellow member George Weiland started team teaching free classes at CLBC. Both were certified ACBL teachers.

Dave has been teaching bridge for 22 years. Many of the CLBC A players started out as his students. To date, he has taught 805 students and that doesn't include all the students influenced during his many mini classes at Unit 174 tournaments over the years. Many of the members of the CLBC attribute the club's success to him and believe his dedication to the game of

duplicate bridge is the lifeblood of the club. Among Dave's beginning students, five have gone on to become members of the Unit 174 Board of Directors. Three have served as the unit's presidents.

One of his proudest awards was the year he and one other were awarded the Unit 174 Goodwill Awards. He was one of the first recipients of the award. He has been awarded the District 16 Teacher of the Year and the ATBA Teacher of the Year awards. Dave served as the District 16 Teacher of the Year Committee chair and has also been a member of that committee as well.

He still plays with his longtime partner, JD Frick. That partnership has been ongoing for 30 years.

Dave and Becky have been married for 61 years. They have two daughters, 12 grandchildren and two great grandchildren with the third due this June.





Every Card


Sometimes every card is important. Follow the play of this hand. I was defender in the A/X/Y teams on the final day of the recent NABC in Louisville, Kentucky.

South opened 1NT, North used Texas 4♦ to transfer to 4♥, checked for keycards, and then bid 7♣, intending to give South a choice of grand slams in clubs or hearts. South chose hearts.



The opening lead was a diamond by West, dummy's ◆A wins perforce as East follows with the ◆2 and you play the ◆7. It looks like you have 13 tricks if you can bring in the heart suit, with one spade, five hearts, three diamonds, and five clubs.

You are a bit short of entries to your hand (South). At trick 2 you decide to cash the ♥A and to your surprise you see East drop the ♥Q.



What now? Plan the play and be specific. You cannot lose a single trick. Don't peek!

OK, got your plan? Read on.

What did you play from your hand (South) on the above trick?

You noticed the ♥Q and did some quick figuring to realize that West started with the ♥86542. No problem, right? Trick three you can lead a heart to your nine, get back to dummy with a club, and then draw the rest of the trump.

Except that you have nine clubs, the opponents have only four, and those four will split 4-0 10% of the time – are you willing to risk losing the match on a 90% shot, or would you rather go for a 100% line? Is there a better line of play?

Note: You can't get back to dummy by ruffing a diamond because even one ruff in dummy leaves West with more trump than you have.

Unless East is truly Machiavellian, the play of the ♥Q shows a singleton. If you're paying close attention, you can realize that West's heart holding was ♥86542, and you are able to finesse against the heart 8 but only if you analyze the suit and take care to unblock your heart 9 under the Ace! You can then lead a spade to the ♠A, take the heart finesse ending in dummy(North), draw all the trump, and use the ♣A as an entry to your diamonds before cashing the rest of your clubs (the losing spades in your hand get pitched away on the last three rounds of trump).

On this hand, on this day, clubs were indeed split 4-0. Failing to unblock the ♥9 sent the contract to its doom. Fortunately it was not our side! What could have been a solid win for the other team turned into a tie in a wild match with a score of 37-37 IMPs. Seventy-four IMPs scored in an eight-board match is almost a game swing on every hand, quite unusual!

Lessons:

- 1. It is important to pay attention to every card.
- 2. When something unexpected happens, take a moment to understand how the landscape of this particular hand has changed, and to modify your plan if necessary.
- 3. Don't settle for the 90% shot, if there's a 100% shot. Take the time in difficult contracts to look for a less-obvious line of play that can give you a better chance than your first thought.
