



## **Dummy Reversal**

#### **Dummy Reversal**

In a normal trump contract, the declarer's trumps are as long as or longer than the dummy's (an exception being after a transfer). Typically, a declarer can increase the number of tricks by taking a ruff in hand with fewer trumps. For example, if the declarer has five trumps and dummy has three trumps, the declarer can take six trumps if tricks can be trumped something with the three-card holding; five trumps in the declarer's hand plus one ruff in the dummy adds up to six.

In a dummy reversal, the declarer increases the number of tricks by ruffing in the long hand until this holding is shorter than the number of trumps held by the dummy. For example, if the declarer has five trumps and the dummy three trumps, the declarer can take six trumps if able to trump three times in the long hand; three ruffs in declarer's hand plus dummy's three trumps adds up to six.

You and your partner have done very well to bid 6♠ with a minimum point count. South is declaring six spades in a matchpoint event. These are the two hands:

North

♠ QJ3

♥ A742

◆ 532

♣ AK6

South

♠ AK1084

♥ 3

◆ A4

♣ QJ1082

The \$2 is led and the declarer starts to plan. This looks terrific! South has five spades, one heart, one diamond and five clubs for a total of 12 tricks. You should get a terrific score for getting to the laydown slam.

However, since it is matchpoints, you should always see if there is an extra trick available, which would surely garner a top. It doesn't look promising. After drawing trumps and running clubs, it seems unrealistic to think that you could get a trick with the ♥7 in the dummy or the ♦4 in your hand.

It's time to put on your dummy reversal hat. What if you could trump three hearts in declarer's (South's) hand? You would then have three trumps in dummy, three trumps in your hand (i.e., six trump tricks), the ♥A, ◆A and five clubs a total of 13 tricks.

For this to happen you will need trumps and clubs to be break three-two (there is also an outside chance that the person holding four clubs is also the person holding three trumps).

In attempting to get a 13th trick, you want to ensure you don't end up going down. For the first trick, float the ♠2 around to your hand, capturing East's spade with the ♠8 or ♠10, depending upon whether East plays small or the ♠9. For this example, we'll assume that East plays a small card and you win with the ♠8. Next, ♥3 to the ♥A and trump the ♥2 with the ♠A.

Now play the  $\clubsuit 4$  to dummy's  $\spadesuit J$  and, assuming that everyone follows, trump the  $\blacktriangledown 4$  with your  $\spadesuit K$ . At this point the position is:

North

♠ Q

♥ 7

♦ 532

♣ AK6

South

♠ 10

♥ 
♦ A4

♣ QJ1082

Lead a club to dummy's ♣A and trump dummy's last heart with your ♠10. Finally, lead a second club to dummy's ♣K and draw the last trump with the ♠Q. On this trick, having no spades left, you pitch your losing ◆4. Lead a club or diamond to your hand and claim!

Remember you don't want to sacrifice the cold contract going for an overtrick. Make sure at trick four, when you lead to the dummy's  $\clubsuit$ J, if someone shows out, you stop the dummy reversal plan, draw trumps, and take your guaranteed 12 tricks.

What if someone trumps the first or second club? In that case, all the trumps are accounted for (remember, you have drawn two), so you run the clubs pitching two diamonds in the dummy and get your 12<sup>th</sup> trick by ruffing a diamond in the dummy.

#### **Summary**

Most of the time one increases the number of trump tricks by ruffing something in the hand with short trumps. On occasion, if the conditions are right, it is possible to increase the number of trump tricks by ruffing in the hand with long trumps until the number of trumps held is smaller than the trumps held in the short hand (i.e., dummy reversal).

For most people, your author included, the problem is more of recognizing the possibility instead of the difficulty of play. In the example hand, if one were asked to play a dummy reversal, one would have little difficulty.

Conversely, if asked to make a plan with the example hand, most people would draw trumps and hope that the defense really screws up and allows you to take one of the small red cards; most people would not recognize a dummy reversal.
