President's Message

You may have noticed that qualifying for the North American Pairs Championship has begun at the club level! From there, we will have qualifying at the Unit level and then on to the District level, which will be January 20-21 in San Antonio (finals at Spring Nationals). The District has also voted to promote more participation in the GNT events (finals at Summer Nationals) as well, by adding club qualifying, so this is very exciting.

Unit 174 and District 16 have a new champion for charitable causes. **Nancy Strohmer**, Chair of the District 16 Charity Committee, has resurrected the District Charity Games this year, and charity games were held in March. A total of \$1884 was raised, and 35 of the 156 active clubs in District 16 participated. Thanks to all! We hope for a larger participation next year! The applicants for awards totaled 68, and the recipients of the D16 grants were **Friends of the Family, Denton; Mowat-Wilson Syndrome Family Foundation, Houston;** and **Sick Children's Clinic, Lubbock**. More details may be found at the Unit 174 Website. Your Unit 174 Board has approved a Unit Charity Week in December after StaC Week, and club managers will soon receive information about it. This is one of our really worthwhile activities, as the extra dollar paid goes to charity, and the games are eligible for higher masterpoint awards. This makes for a Win-Win! The charity of Unit 174 is SEARCH, and information may be found at the Unit Website (<u>www.acblunit174.org)</u>.

The Board is working hard to prepare for the **"Awesome August" Sectional**, and flyers are posted at the Website. We carefully considered all comments from the June Sectional and made changes based on input from the members. The Sunday entry fee will be only \$10 (reduced from the \$15 stated on earlier flyers) and will *not* include lunch. You may find lunch nearby or from the hotel offerings that will include a concession stand as well as buffet and menu in the dining room. To make things even easier, lunch times will be *staggered*. Complimentary coffee will be offered only at the start of each morning session, and will be in 8-ounce cups (rather than 6). From 11 to 3 daily, coffee will be available at the concession stand for \$1.50.

Our excellent speakers are **Joyce Ryan**, **Mildred Breed**, and **Betty Starzec**, so you will definitely want to plan to hear them. Finally, each year the Board runs an experimental event at the August Sectional. This year it will be a two-day, four-session Pairs Championship, to be held on Friday and Saturday, August 11-12. The Unit is holding such an event at the Lone Star Regional, so this will be a test for us to determine the attendance to be expected at the Regional. Half the field advances from the first day to the second, and one pair will eventually be named the Unit 174 Pairs Champion!
