News from Clubs

The game at **Lakeside Country Club** has been canceled, along with its sanction. This was necessary due to the awful damage to the entire property caused by Hurricane Harvey. The country club will be undergoing major repairs and renovations to both the buildings and golf course for an estimated *two years*. We continue to hear of horror stories from that awful flooding.

Spring Branch Duplicate Club celebrated its **25th anniversary** on Thursday, October 5, with 31 tables. Think of that: 25 continuous years serving the Houston bridge community. I'd bet they have some stories to tell, wouldn't you? Looking back on its history we learn that the late **Dr. Edgar Hoffing's** unbridled passion for duplicate bridge led to the establishment of the first sanctioned duplicate game held at a community center in Houston on October 7, 1992. Players demanded more, and the game grew from a weekly game to two games a week, held on Mondays and Thursdays. Today, 25 years later, **Judith Hoffing** continues her husband's dream by managing and directing SBDC at the beautiful community center located on Wirt Road at Westview. **Congratulations!** Keep up the good work!

They also continue to be successful with their monthly mentor games (day game on 2d Wednesday, 10:30 a.m.) and evening game on 4th Tuesday, 7 p.m.). **Tom Jahnke** is offering a special **10/26 class** on Overcalls for intermediate and advanced players. What an important part of bridge that is not always well understood by some players. I love this quote from the ACBL: *"When an opponent opens the bidding, your side is put at a disadvantage. Nonetheless, the overcall can be an effective tool, both for getting your side into the auction and for keeping the opponents from finding their best contract. It comes in a variety of guises."* The more we learn about bridge, the more we become convinced that it is a **bidder's game**. Oh yes, a Pass may be the best bid in bridge—when made at the right time—but you must get into the auction when you can. Points are not earned by fraidy-cats who pass too much. Final Thoughts

Our hearts continue to go out to our many, many players who suffered major losses from the menace known as Harvey. BBC reported that 100,000 homes were affected, and 40,000 homes were reported completely lost. A team from Baylor Medical College and Rice University reported that floodwaters in Houston neighborhoods were contaminated with toxins and bacteria that can make people sick. Some of our players experienced that firsthand. And in this huge city where we cannot live without our cars, about **One Million** vehicles were lost in the flooding. We realize that both FEMA and the insurance companies are inundated, but the many reports of delays by the insurance companies are creating justified anger. Nevertheless, we are surviving it, and what a testament it is to our strength.

But back to Bridge: Conventions are fun, and bidding is fun, and it's fun to legally talk across the table, isn't it? But I see many players who start out by trying to learn as many conventions as they can, and who feel that others are disappointed in them because they don't have a lot of gadgets marked on their convention cards. I'd like to help them dispel that feeling, because mastering the fundamentals produces better results than a complicated card. One of the most basic fundamentals is COUNTING. How many bridge players do you see who don't know they have good tricks because they failed to count the suit? (Sometimes when those tricks are on the board, everybody else at the table knows it!) How many, even experienced players, don't really keep track of those important spot cards (8s and 9s especially)? A lowly deuce that is the 13th card of the suit in NT is as powerful as any Ace. Early in the hand, try to get a picture of the other three hands from the bidding. You'd be surprised how much information you have. Just turn it into knowledge remembered for the play or defense, and you'll be MPs ahead of your cohorts.
